What are Mail Thieves Looking For?


- Cash
- Gift cards
- Merchandise (packages)
- Credit cards
- Personal identifiers
- CHECKS, CHECKS, and MORE CHECKS





Forgery / Alteration

- Original check with altered payee and/or amount
- Requires account in the names of the new payee, typically a co-conspirator
- Physical signs








Counterfeiting

- "Stolen check +"
- Need a source of account info (Insider, Dark Web, Mail Theft)

Need an account (Fake ID, Recruited "Mule" – collusive

accountholder)



- No check alteration required
- Targets business checks
 - High dollar value
 - Perception of less scrutiny
- Need a business license
 - Readily attainable online
- Use business license to open business account







New Account Fraud

- Requires sources of:
 - Checks
 - Supporting Documents
 - Fake IDs
- Readily obtainable by:
 - Self-Production
 - Document Labs
 - Dark Web
- Harder to detect
 - "One and Done"












How is Mail Stolen?

- Individual mailboxes ("red flagging")
- Blue Collection Boxes
 - Crowbars and other pry tools
 - Fishing (string and adhesive)
 - Sticky Traps (mouse traps or other adhesives)
- Stolen or Counterfeit Arrow keys
 - USPS keys that open mailboxes in specific areas







What Can Banks & Credit Unions Do?

- Educate customers –
 especially young
 customers about
 cashing checks for other
 people
- Scrutinize the date on a business check with the date on the business license for a new business accountholder

- Encourage businesses to use Positive Pay
- Encourage customers to report check fraud to local law enforcement
- Encourage customers to report mail theft to the USPIS
- Keep the original checks negotiated
 - uspis.gov/report
